n 2013, 12 servant leaders were brought together to create the foundation for StepUp Durham. They helped to establish the tenets and tone for the organization. Daily we work towards living into these values of being inclusive, asset-based and community-centered. Many of these leaders are still connected with the organization today – as board members, accountability partners and investors. We believe that their work has been honored, and they continue to be excited about what we are accomplishing together.

This first year has been about building – building trust, building partnerships and building a donor base. We have seen success on all fronts, having built strong partnerships with Durham agencies doing great work and exceeding our financial goals in the first fiscal year. Between October 2015 and the close of our fiscal year in June 2016, we assisted 33 adults in obtaining employment, helped 10 people work their way out of homelessness, established relationships with 40 Durham employers, and grew our donor base from zero to 180.

As we settle into our second year, the focus is depth and collaboration. We look to strengthen our relationship with partner agencies by sharing resources and pursuing collaborative funding. For our graduates, we will move beyond employment to supporting a better quality of life for the entire family.

TRAINING

The first step in the StepUp process is employment. Our one-week, 32-hour Employment Readiness Workshop takes place at various sites in Durham (all with easy access to the bus line). Trained staff teach employment seekers how to complete a job application, build a resume, dress professionally, communicate effectively, manage time, and interview well. Meals are provided each day, and participants receive free professional attire through Dress for Success and SuitedNSuccess.

After graduating from the Employment Readiness Workshop, participants become partners with StepUp Durham and receive an Employment Counselor. This staff member works one-on-one with each participant to create an action plan for securing employment. During the partnership, participants attend a weekly motivational class called ENER-G (Empowerment, Networking, Employment, Resources, and Growth). Here, participants meet employers, review job leads, practice interviewing and time management skills, and share community with other job seekers.

One of the unique elements of StepUp Durham is its joint focus on job seeker training and employer recruitment. The StepUp model includes staff members, known as Employment Recruiters, who spend time cultivating and maintaining trusted referral partnerships with local companies. StepUp Durham provides the businesses with candidate screening, training, referral, and support services.
