This fiscal year, we increased our job placements, grew our Build apprenticeship program, deepened our partnership with Durham Tech through Elevate, and launched resiliency trainings to support our participants with some of their mental health needs. Our work has positioned us to lead Durham's Guaranteed Income pilot, giving us the opportunity explore ways to eradicate poverty on a national level. Excel, which will provide an unconditional payment of \$500 per month to help evaluate the impact of guaranteed income on recidivism and re-incarceration, launches this fall.

This year and a half has reaffirmed my belief that we should embrace every season on our journey, because when an opportunity presents itself, we want to seize it. As I look back, my sincere thanks to each of you for the investments of time, talent and treasure you have made in StepUp Durham! ### Timing Is Everything

I rarely say no, but I'm also a person who does not like to hear the word no. Fundamentally, I believe that many "noes" are really "not right now," AND that in many cases a no can become a yes if given time. When you read the stories of David, John, and Vivian, the theme of timing emerges – the doors that opened when John felt like he had limited options, the opportunities that arose when Vivian was positioned for a new career, and how David's readiness to use the skills he learned at StepUp helped him secure his dream job.

When I think back on StepUp's six years in Durham, our journey has been similar. At one point, we thought we might have to close our doors due to limited resources. Now, even in the midst of what feels like a never-ending pandemic, we have seen growth and feel ready and well-placed to take on new and exciting challenges.

#### **ENER-G**


Employment. Networking. Empowerment, Resources, and Growth! ENER-G is the kick start to your job search each week, after completing our free 3-day employment workshop.

When David



David entered the Job Readiness Workshop with StepUp and found he could benefit from the skills taught. "I started working on interview skills and working on my resume. I thought I had things going well and doing things right with my resume and interview skills being a college graduate, but it couldnt've been further from the truth."

StepUp taught David how to navigate discussing his criminal background during interviews, and it has made all the difference. "It's been phenomenal. I've referred everyone that I'm talking to. Especially if you have a tethered background, gaps in employment history or if you've been incarcerated."

Since joining StepUp Durham, David has been able to secure safe transportation and begin a career that has set his eyes on the future. "When I first started StepUp, I really only thought I'd have a job in construction, nothing career oriented." Thankfully, David is now in a career as an Outreach Specialist at Housing for New Hope, assisting people who have had similar experiences to himself

Because of the skills StepUp has given David, he has set goals to secure his own living space, reunite with his son, and to continue developing strong relationships like the ones he has cultivated in StepUp.

## PARTICIPANTS'JOURNEY

Step2 offers four phases of programming that occur in eight-week blocks. The four phases are: Personal **Development, Financial Education, Career** Development, and Leadership Development.



#### StepUp Kidz

StepUp Kidz supports the children of Step2 parents as they develop their own financial stability and habits, while also encouraging personal and academic well-being and success.





had nowhere else to turn. Looking for work in the middle of a pandemic with a felony on his record, it seemed like there was little hope for his future. "It was during a time when things were so hard for me. I didn't know which way to go or what to do. It was at a point in my life that felt like rock bottom."

Timing is everything, and luckily, one of the case managers for Volunteers for America recommended StepUp Durham to John.

"I was having trouble finding a job because I am a felon, you know. One of the facilitators with StepUp made me feel comfortable because he shared my experience of having a criminal background. I told them about my experience and what I've been through, they made me feel really good, counseled me, prayed with me - everything a family could do for me. They were there for me when I didn't have anyone else."

Through collaboration with StepUp Durham's Build program, John was given the opportunity to work with Scrap Exchange and met amazing, loving people there. He was able to secure permanent job with the Scrap Exchange because of this. After his initial success, John decided to pursue StepUp Durham's other programs. Through Elevate, he was able to continue his learning to be better equipped to advance and serve the organization.

In Durham's Guaranteed Income Pilot, or Excel, 115 formerly-incarcerated individuals will be randomly selected to receive an unconditional, cash transfer of \$500 per month. The pilot will last one year.

The objective of Durham's Excel Pilot Program is to evaluate guaranteed income's effects on recidivism and re-incarceration, employment, economic security and income volatility, as well as physical functioning, mental health, stress and coping, parenting, housing, and interactions with other institutional systems.

John enrolled in Durham Tech's Forklift Certification program at no cost, and has now been promoted within the Scrap Exchange to play a major role in operations, customer service, inventory, scheduling and more. He is one of only two employees within the Scrap Exchange with a Forklift Certification.

John says, "It makes my job a lot easier and I can support my coworkers. I'm looking forward to earning more certifications with StepUp Durham's help." Throughout this process, John has modeled patience, optimism, and gratitude. All of that said, John has been most grateful for StepUp Durham because, "They instilled a belief that I can keep going. They have shown me to never give up." John thrives in a community where he is seen, heard, and valued, not based on his background, but for his authenticity. Thankfully, he found that with StepUp Durham.

began working with StepUp Durham in 2018, she had just lost her job and needed help. She found StepUp, enrolled in the lob Readiness Workshop, and after securing work, she enrolled in Step2 to develop other skills. "I have been a part of the StepUp community ever since."

Vivian participated in classes and built lasting relationships with StepUp Durham staff - then the global pandemic hit and she was faced with job loss again. "I reached out to StepUp and re-engaged to find work." Through StepUp, Vivian was able to learn about Hope Renovations and secure a spot in their program. "StepUp wants to see me succeed. If they don't know the answer, they work with someone who can help me."

After her experience with New Hope Renovations, she pursued furthering her education through StepUp Durham's Elevate program. Vivian chose to seek out a Forklift Certification from Durham Tech, not realizing how soon her certification would come in handy. "I got the training before I knew about the job, and it ended up being exactly what I needed!"

After receiving her certification, Vivian was able to secure a new position with an independent lumber company in Carrboro, NC and uses her certification often. Because of the skills developed during StepUp programming, Vivian has her eyes set on the future.

"I have a lot of goals, and with guidance they are attainable. I want to build a savings account and turn \$1000 into \$10,000. I want to create a retirement account so I am not uncomfortable in my old age. I want to prepare for my child's retirement so they don't have to struggle like I have. In our country many of us are one bad accident from being bankrupt and homeless. I would like to be part of the solution that helps people avoid that."
